•	Create a plan that addresses ONE of the district's greatest diversity and inclusion needs. Your plan must include the following:

	A system for tracking results of this effort. i.e. how will you determine whether your effort has been successful?
	A signature from the person responsible for executing your plan.

• An accountability report is due to the IdTA on or before January 15, 2026. Failure to provide a report or failure to use the grant for the requested purpose will jeopardize your eligibility for a grant in the future.

The maximum grant amount awarded is \$1,500 for any one organization member, tennis partner or CTA. We reserve the right to award less than \$1,500 if your plan is deemed "light" by the grant review team. In addition, applying does not guarantee a grant will be awarded.

By completing and signing this form, the organization member, or tennis partner agrees to provide the IdTA a final report by **January 15, 2026**. We also recognize that being held accountable for the funds we receive by reporting our results and best practices will improve our chances for additional funding in the future.
